Important Note:

This amigurumi is worked with tight V-shaped and spiral stitches. Do not close off each row unless indicated; make sure to always mark the beginning of each row. Please read the entire pattern before starting. We have a tutorial on our channel to make this amigurumi. You can access the links attached to each image if you have any questions. If you find any errors in this pattern, please contact me.



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Tosino is an iconic avatar within the Roblox universe, and in this pattern I will guide you step by step to crochet him in his amigurumi version. This design has been created with great detail to capture his essence and take him from the digital world to crochet.

If you follow this pattern, I'd love to see your version! You can share it on social media using the hashtag #GretaWings.

This amigurumi is approximately 8 inches (20cm) tall, and you can articulate its body.

This amigurumi stands upright.

MATERIALS

- 100% Mercerized Cotton Yarn (Sinfonía brand or similar), medium thickness (approx. 3mm).
 - Colors: White, Black, Cinnamon (hair),
 Gray, Mango Yellow, Mandarin (orange),
 and Turquoise Blue.
 - Crochet Hook: 2.5 mm
- Super fine black sewing thread (for embroidering the eyes).
- Yarn needle
- Scissors
- Stitch marker
- Pins
- Amigurumi stuffing
- Glue.
- Black and Lilac felt (for the glasses).

ABBREVIATIONS

- R: Round
- ch: Chain
- MR: Magic ring
- · sc: Single crochet
- dec: Decrease (join 2 sc together)
- inc: Increase (2 sc in 1 stitch)
- dc: Double crochet
- hdc: Half double crochet

IMPORTANT NOTES

- ☑ The pattern is worked in continuous spiral rounds (unless otherwise specified).
- Use a stitch marker to keep track of the rounds.
- ✓ The invisible finish technique is used in some parts for a cleaner look.
- ☑ BLO and FLO techniques are used in certain sections to add texture.
- ☑ Sewing the pieces requires patience to maintain the original shape of the character.
- ☑ If you want a bigger or smaller Tosino, you can change the yarn thickness and hook size.



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HANDS (x2)

Color: White


Note: The hands consist of two pieces that will be joined at the end.

Piece #1 (x2)


• IMPORTANT: In R1, place a marker on chain number 12 before continuing. This will help you accurately locate the point where the increases will be made later.

R1: 12ch, in the 2nd ch from the hook (10sc, 4sc in the same stitch)x2 (28)

R2: (10sc, 1inc, 2sc, 1inc)x2 (32) R3: 1sc, 1tr dec, 2sc, 1tr dec, 8sc, 1tr dec, 2sc, 1tr dec, 7sc (24)



Make a perfect closure using a wool needle wool needle

Let me explain what a perfect closure is:

- After cutting the thread, pull it out and attach a tapestry needle.
- Skip one stitch and, in the next stitch, pass the tapestry needle under the chain that forms above the stitch.
- Then insert the tapestry needle just above the last stitch you made.

Whenever a perfect close is mentioned, follow these steps exactly.

Piece #2 (x2)

1ch to secure.

Tip: When turning each row, ensure that the stitches remain aligned properly.

R1: 5ch, in the 2nd ch from the hook, 4sc (4)

R2-8: turn, 4sc (4)

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Assembling Piece #2 with Piece #1 In Piece #2, we work 4 stitches on the top and 4 stitches
 on the bottom.

On each side, we knit 8 rounds, which is equivalent to 8 stitches per side.

Therefore, the structure of Piece #2 is as follows:

 \checkmark 4 points up \checkmark 4 points down \checkmark 8 points on the right side \checkmark 8 points on the left side Total calculation:

4 (top) + 4 (bottom) + 8 (right side) + 8 (left side) = 24 points ★ Why is this important? In Piece #1, we also have 24 stitches in total, which means they must match up perfectly when joined together.

How to join them correctly:

- 1 Locate one of the curved sides of Piece #1.
- 2 Align the top 4 points of Piece #2 with one of these curved sides.
- 3 Check that the 8 side points of Piece #2 align with the corresponding ones on Piece #1.
- 4 Sew both pieces with a thinner thread than the main thread to achieve a more delicate and less visible seam.
- 5 Before completing the closure, place a pinch of filler inside (optional), this will give it a little more volume and better shape.
- 6 Finish sewing by securing the stitches well and hiding the thread inside.
- ₱ Tip: To prevent your piece from shifting while you sew, use pins or markers to hold it in place before you begin stitching.



Colors. Black and Willie

★ Important notes:

✓ Start with white thread and change to black at the top.

✓ R2 and R3 in BLO/FLO for texture.

✓ R5 reverse for curvature.

✓ R10 in BLO with pd for color transition

R1: MR 8sc

R2: BLO 8sc (8)

R3: FLO 8inc (16)

R4: (1sc, 1inc)x8 (24)

R5: 24sc reverse (crochet the reverse to generate

curvature)


R6: (4sc, 1dec)x4 (20)

♣ Optional: After the R6, apply a small amount of silicone to the tip of the arm and let it dry. Then, add another layer on top to keep the base flat after the filling.

✓ Improves stability without deforming the shape.

✓ If you prefer flexibility, skip this step.

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R7-9: 20sc

📌 Color change to black.

Follow these steps for color change:

- Finish the last stitch of the round and pull out the yarn over a little.
- Insert the hook through the center of the stitch, as shown in the picture.
- Draw the new color and start the next round.
- Before finishing this round, pull the strand of the previous color and secure it to the new color with a simple knot.
- Leave the strands inside the piece so that they become part of the filling.

- ✓ Achieve perfect closure.

Joining the arm with the hands

- **★** Important:
- ✓ The color change on the arms should remain on the back of the body.
- √ The horseshoe-shaped hands should face the body.
- ✓ This union can be done later if you prefer.
- ✓ Use a thinner thread and take the front threads left on the R1 of the arm for a cleaner seam.

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LEGS (x2)

Colors: Black and White

Start with white thread and 1 slip knot.

R1: 6ch, in the 2nd start (4sc, 1triple inc)x2 (14)


◆ IMPORTANT: In R1, place a marker on chain number 12 before continuing. This will help you accurately locate the point where the increases will be worked later.

R2: (4sc, 3inc)x2 (20)

R3: 5sc, 4inc, 6sc, 4inc, 1sc (28)

R4: BLO 28sc

Note: Working in Back Loop Only (BLO) will give us a firmer base for the shoe. https://youtu.be/wHnnNO7SCIE?t=255



R5-7: 28 sc

Once you've finished R7, place the base on a flat surface and apply melted hot silicone glue. Make sure to heat up your glue gun very well, as the heat will allow the base to set on its own. When the silicone cools, the base will become firm, allowing your amigurumi to stand up very well on its own.

If you prefer, you can also cut a piece of plastic that works well as reinforcement. I do not recommend using cardboard, as it could deform over time and affect the stability of your amigurumi.

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R8: 1bp, 8dis mp, 11bp (20) 🖈 Explanation:

- ✓ These half double crochet (HDC) decreases shape the curve of the shoe.
- ✓ Leave the white thread facing outward without cutting, as it will be used for the shoe detail later.

CONTINUATION OF THE LEGS

- **★** IMPORTANT:
- ✓ We will start with black yarn in the 5th stitch counting backwards from where you finished.
- ✓ Make sure to knit in BLO to maintain the shape of the shoe.

R9: BLO 1ch, at the same base start 20sc (20) https://youtu.be/wHnnNO7SCIE?t=780





R10-20: 20sc

- ✓ On the first leg, cut the thread and make a perfect closure.
- ✓ On the second leg, DO NOT cut the thread, as it will be used to continue joining the legs to the body.

SHOE DETAIL

Color: White

(with the thread that we left in R8)

★ IMPORTANT:

- ✓ We will work in FLO, starting at the next available point.
- ✓ Make sure the increases are well distributed to achieve the desired shape.

FLO 1ch, starting from the following point:

- \checkmark 3dc, 1ch, 1sc at the base of the last dc, 1sc in the next stitch.
- ✓ 1ch, on the same base start 6dc, 1ch, 1ss, another 1ss.
- √ 1ch, 3hdc, 8sc.
- ✓ Make a perfect closure using a wool needle.

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Note: It is recommended to use shrink wrap on the areas knitted with white yarn to prevent them from getting dirty with use or handling. This will help keep the amigurumi clean for longer without altering its appearance.



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- $\not r$ Before starting the R21, it is necessary to prepare the joining of the legs.
- Leg alignment:

Before starting the next round, it is important to determine which will be the center side of each leg.

- ✓ Place a temporary pin or marker on the side of each leg.
- ✓ Make sure both legs are facing forward before joining them together.
- ✓ It may be necessary to move some stitches in this round to achieve better alignment.
- Stitches may be slightly offset when joining legs. If necessary, add or remove single crochets before joining.

The goal is to reach the marker on each leg before starting the join, ensuring that the knitting remains neat.

R21: 18sc, 2ch, 20sc, 2sc in the 2ch, 2sc (44)

- **★** IMPORTANT:
- Check that the legs continue to face forward after joining.

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R22-31: 44sc

R32: 8sc, 2inc, 20sc, 2inc, 12sc (48)

✓ Here we add strategic increases on the sides to give volume to the torso.

R33: 48sc

R34: 9sc, 2inc, 22sc, 2inc, 13sc (52)


★ Tip: Make sure the increases are evenly distributed to maintain symmetry.

R35: 52sc

- Union of arms:
- Before starting the next round, place markers where the arms will join to prevent them from getting crooked.
- ★ First round of joining:

R36: 9sc, 4sc joining arm and body, 22sc, 4sc joining arm and body, 13sc (76)

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★ Second round of joining:

R37: 9sc, 16sc on the arm, 22sc, 16sc on the arm, 13sc (76)

On the arms we will work on the 16 stitches that we left free and on the body we will skip the 4 of each union

R38-40: 76sc

₱ Body shaping:

✓ You can gradually fill the body to prevent the shape from deforming.

R41: 9sc, 8dec, 22sc, 8dec, 13sc (60)

R42: (3sc, 1dec)x12 (48) R43: (1sc, 1dec)x16 (32) R44: (2sc, 1dec)x8 (24)

R45: 24sc

✓ Stuff the body very well, making sure to distribute the stuffing evenly.

Make a perfect closure.

HEAD

Color: White

★ IMPORTANT: To ensure the head maintains its cubic shape, knit with firm tension and place the stuffing evenly, paying special attention to the corners.

 Place a marker at the first stitch of each round to avoid losing count.

R1: MR 8sc

R2: 8inc (16)

R3: (2sc, 2inc)x4 (24)

R4: 3sc, 2inc, (4sc, 2inc)x3, 1sc (32) R5: 4sc, 2inc, (6sc, 2inc)x3, 2sc (40) https://youtu.be/K0hS2IIIIGU?t=11



R6-19: 40sc

R20: 4sc, 2dec, (6sc, 2dec)x3, 2sc (32)
R21: 3sc, 2dec, (4sc, 2dec)x3, 1sc (24)

Leave a long tail to sew to the body.

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UNION OF THE HEAD WITH THE BODY

- ✓ Pin the head in several places to maintain stability while sewing.
- ✓ Check that the head is centered in relation to the torso before starting to sew.
- ✓ Fill the joint well before closing it completely so that it is firm and in good shape.

CENTRAL PIECE OF THE SUIT

Color: Turquoise Blue


Tip: This piece is knitted in rows and then placed on Tosino's torso to simulate the central part of his suit.

R1: 5cc, in the second start, 4sc (4) R2-20: turn, 4sc (4) 1ch to secure and hide the strands.

Placing the Central Piece of the Suit • Options for attaching it to the torso:

- ✓ Option 1 Sew it: Secure the piece with small stitches along the edges so that it stays in place.
- ✓ Option 2 Glue: If you prefer a quicker option, you can attach it with liquid silicone or textile glue. Make sure to apply a thin layer to avoid it being noticeable on the fabric.
- ★ Tip: Before attaching, check that it is well aligned vertically with the head and legs to maintain the symmetry of the design.

CORD FOR JACKET

Color: Black

Note: In the explanatory images, the cord is shown with turquoise thread for better understanding, but in the final design it must be woven with black thread to maintain the appearance of the original costume.

- If you need more details about its location and technique, you can check out the tutorial video.
- ✓ Start with 1 slip knot and work 48 sc in a row.

Fixation:

- Make this join with stitches. Secure the cord with small, firm stitches around the edge of the torso to ensure it is well secured and has a clean finish.
- ★ Tip: Before sewing, check that the cord is placed symmetrically and aligned to highlight the design of the jacket.

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Seam Fixation:

- ₱ Step by step to place the cord:
- 1 Start on the right side of the turquoise piece and go down to the bottom of the torso.
- 2 Fold the cord at the base and continue sewing towards the back of the amigurumi.
- 3 Continue sewing to the other side of the blue piece, making sure the shape remains uniform.
- 4 Hide the remaining strands inside the fabric, inserting them with the tapestry needle for a clean finish.

HAIR

Color: Cinnamon

R1: (12ch, on the 3rd start BLO 10hdc)x30 1ch to secure and hide the strands.

Hair Placement

 Note: For a better finish, the strands should be placed with the front facing inwards before securing.

Step by step for placement:

- 1 Start placing the strands under the last rounds of increases, working in an upward spiral until the head is covered.
- 2 Apply glue only to the base of each strand, using liquid silicone or textile glue to fix them firmly without it being noticeable on the fabric.
- 3 Make sure to distribute the strands evenly around your head to avoid gaps and achieve a neat finish.
- ★ Tip: Before fixing all the strands, place some test strands to visualize the distribution and make sure the result is as expected.

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SHOULDERS (x2)

Color: Light Grey

Note: These shoulder pads are knitted in a single cylindrical piece and closed at the end to give them shape.

R1: MR 8sc

R2: 8inc (16)

R3: (2sc, 2inc)x4 (24)

R4: 3sc, 2inc, (4sc, 2inc)x3, 1sc (32)

R5: 4sc, 2inc, (6sc, 2inc)x3, 2sc (40)

Closing the shoulder:

✓ R19: 15 sc to close → Pick up the next stitch and the second to last stitch of the last round as you make each sc. This will create a slight tilt in the piece.

✓ R20: 7sc closing → Fold the piece in half and weave through both layers to seal the top.

✓ 1ch to secure and hide the strand.

• Placement: Flip the piece over before gluing so that the closed side is facing down. Then, attach the shoulder pads to the upper torso with glue, making sure they are symmetrical on both sides.



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GLASSES ••

- 📌 Materials: Black and purple felt
- ✓ Step 1: Cut out two full pieces in black for the base.
- ✓ Step 2: Cut out two pieces in lilac following the shape of the highlighted area.
- ✓ Step 3: Make sure the purple felt completely covers the black felt before joining them together. You can adjust this to your preference.
- ✓ Step 4: Join both layers of felt as shown in the image.
- Placement on the face:
- Separation: Leave approximately 2 points of distance between the lenses and the head.
- Height: It will depend on the position of the hair.
- Tilt: Ensure that the sides are tilted slightly downwards.
- Gluing: Apply glue only to the central sides, leaving the outer edges slightly detached from the face to give a more realistic effect.

MOUTH 😊

- ✓ Step 1: Embroider the mouth using a strand of black thread, making sure that the shape is defined according to the desired expression.
- ✓ Step 2: To secure it in place, pin it in place before applying glue.
- ✓ Step 3: Apply glue very carefully, avoiding excess so that it does not stain the thread or the surface of the face.
- ✓ Alternative option: If you prefer, instead of gluing it, you can sew it directly to the face for a firmer and more detailed finish.

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LAYER AND DETAILS

Color: Tangerine

Start with 1 slip knot

R1: 26ch, in the 3rd begin, BLO 24hdc (24)

R2-20: 2ch, turn, 24hdc (24)

Layer detail

Color: Mango yellow MR, 2ch, 10dc, 2ch, 1ss.

Close the ring before hiding the strands.

★ Tip: Adjust the magic ring tightly.
