Important Note:

This amigurumi is worked with tight V-shaped and spiral stitches. Do not close off each row unless indicated; make sure to always mark the beginning of each row. Please read the entire pattern before starting. We have a tutorial on our channel to make this amigurumi. You can access the links attached to each image if you have any questions. If you find any errors in this pattern, please contact me.





Ariel is approximately 12 inches (30cm) tall.



Materials:

- We have used 100% mercerized cotton yarn, approximately 3 mm thick with 6 plies, in the following colors: Skin tone (30g), Pink, Light Pink, White, Brown (for eyebrows), and Deep Red.
- Materials needed:
- 2.5 mm crochet hook
- 10 mm safety eyes
- Tapestry needle
- Scissors
- Stitch marker
- Pins
- Amigurumi stuffing
- Hot glue stick or wire
- Glue
- Velcro for the dress closure
- Blush (optional)

Abreviaturas:

- R: Ronda
- c: cadeneta
- AM: Anillo mágico
- Pb: punto bajo
- dis: disminución (cerrar 2pb juntos)
- aum: Aumento (2pb en 1 punto)
- pa: punto alto
- mpa: medio punto alto
- pd: Punto deslizado
- FLO: Front Loop Only (tomar sólo la hebra delantera)
- BLO: Back Loop Only (tomar sólo la hebra trasera)

Important Note:

This pattern can be adapted to create amigurumis of different sizes using different yarn thicknesses. Adjust the hook size according to the thickness of the yarn you choose. Also consider the size of the safety eyes, if you choose to use them.

I hope you enjoy designing this pattern for you as much as I did.





ARMS (X2)

Use flesh-colored yarn

R1: MR 6sc R2: 6inc (12) R3-4: 12sc

R5: 5sc, (bob stitch: 4hdc closed together in the

same place), 6sc (12)

R6: 12sc

R7: (4sc, 1dec)x2 (10)

R8-24: 10sc

Cut the yarn at the end of each arm and fill just a little.

PIERNAS (X2)

Start with flesh-colored thread yarn R1: 4ch, in the 2nd begin (2sc, 1triple inc)x2 (10)

Note: I suggest you mark Chain number 4 before starting to make the first single crochet, because once we crochet the 2nd repetition on the other side of the chains, right in that 4th chain is where we will make the last triple increase

R2: (2sc, 3inc) x2 (16)

R3: 3sc, 4inc, 4sc, 4inc, 1sc (24)

R4: BLO 24sc

R5-7: 24sc

Note: Before continuing, fill the plant with silicone glue. If you do not yet know our technique, please enter the link that I share with you.

R8: 6dec, 12sc (18)

R9: 18sc

R10: 3dec, 6sc, 1dec, 4sc (14)

R11-30: 14scChange to White color yarn

On the first leg you made you will cut the yarn and on the second leg you will change to White in the last single crochet of the R30 to make the underwear.

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R31: 2ch, 14sc on the other leg, 2sc on the 2ch, 14sc on the leg that started this Round (32) link to video



R32-36: 32sc R37: (6sc, 1dec) x4 (28) Change to Flesh color in the last dec of this R.





R38: 28sc R39: (5sc, 1dec) x4 (24) R40-48: 24sc



R49: 9sc, 10sc on one arm, 12sc, 10sc on the other arm, 3sc (44)



Note: Place a marker on each side, exactly where you mark is where you will make the connections with the arms.

R50: (2sc, 1dec) x11 (33)

R51-52: 33sc

R53: (1sc, 1dec) x11 (22)

R54: 22sc



Note: You must fill the fabric as you advance, creating a hole to then insert the silicone tube or whatever material you wish to use to support your head.



R55: 11dec (11) R56-57: 11sc R58: 1inc, 10sc (12)

R60: (3sc, 1inc) x6 (30) R61: (4sc, 1inc) x6 (36)

R62: 2sc, linc, (5sc, linc) x5, 3sc (42)

R63: (6sc, 1inc) x6 (48)

R64: 3sc, linc, (7sc, linc) x5, 4sc (54)


R65: 54sc

R66: (8sc, 1inc) x6 (60)

R67: 4sc, linc, (9sc, linc) x5, 5sc (66)

R68: (10sc, 1inc) x6 (72)

Note: You will need to create a hole in the body, prepare the silicone tube by creating a thin tip so it enters more easily and then insert the silicone, you can actually place it whenever you like

R69-77: 72 sc

R78: (10sc, 1dec)x6 (66)

R79-81: 66sc

Place the eyes between R73 and 74 with

approximately 13 stitches apart



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Note: If you want to further secure these eyes, watch our video where I show you in detail how to do it, but it is optional.



FACE EMBROIDERY

Note: You need to visit our video for all the details of the face, it will be easier for you.



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EARS (X2)

Make the ears with 8 points separating each eye. Their points will be the same, the difference will be where to start each one.

1ch, 1sc, 5hdc in the same stitch, 1sc, 1ss (see video)

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R82: (9sc, 1dec) x6 (60)

R83: 3sc, 1dec, (8sc, 1dec) x5, 5sc (54)

R84: (7sc, 1dec) x6 (48)

R85: 3sc, 1dec, (6sc, 1dec) x5, 3sc (42)

R86: (5sc, 1dec) x6 (36)

Note: It's time to cut the silicone if there is any excess and place filler around it.



R87: (4sc, 1dec)x6 (30) R88: (3sc, 1dec)x6 (24) R89: (2sc, 1dec)x6 (18) R90: (1sc, 1dec)x6 (12)

R91: 6dec (6)

Close with a yarn needle. See the link if

necessary.



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HAIR

Use deep red color yarn

R1: MR 6sc

R2: 6inc (12)

R3: (1sc, 1inc) x6 (18)

R4: (2sc, 1inc) x6 (24)

R5: (3sc, 1inc) x6 (30)

R6: (4sc, 1inc) x6 (36)

R7: 2sc, linc, (5sc, linc) x5, 3sc (42)

R8: (6sc, 1inc) x6 (48)



Large strands (make 37)

1ss, BLO [54ch, in the 3rd beg (1hdc, 1inc hdc)x6, 40hdc, 1ss]x37

To achieve curls only at the ends and not throughout the strand, the result will depend on your weaving tension. If it doesn't turn out the way you want, try these adjustments:

- 1.Looser ends: Crochet the 54 chains with a larger hook (e.g. 3 mm) and the rest with the one indicated in the pattern.
- 2. More curls: Replace 1 dc and 1 dc inc (x6) with 12 dc increases at the beginning.
- 3. Less curls: Instead of 2 dc and 1 inc dc (x6), repeat only 4 times.




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SMALL STRANDS (MAKE 5) [22ch, in the 3rd beg BLO (1hdc, 1inc hdc)x2, 16hdc, skip one stitch, 1ss]x5

Note: Make the last slip stitch (sl st) in the same place you made the first one when you started the strands. Then, bring the strand back and secure it to the beginning of the magic ring (MR) with a knot.

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TO JOIN THE HAIR CORRECTLY:

- 1. Pre-positioning: Use pins to position your hair before securing it. In this case, glue was used, but sewing it in will always be more secure.
- 2. Hair Fixation:
 - Join the center of your hair to the top of your head, making sure to center the 5 smallest strands on your face.
 - The 37 largest strands are distributed in two layers:
 - First layer: Place one strand yes and another no.
 - Second layer: Fill in the remaining gaps. Before joining, make sure the first layer is fully set.
 - On the sides, use two overlapping strands to cover the top and behind the ear.
- 3. Medium strand: Place it in the front, in front of the ear, leaving the tip free.
- 4. Final adjustment: Use your fingers to shape the 5 smallest strands. Then, secure them with blindstitch using only two strands of the same yarn and a yarn needle, securing them at the front of your face and between them.

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DRESS
Start using Pink yarn
Start with 1 slip knot
R1:37ch, in the 2nd start (5sc, 1inc)x6 (42)

R2: turn, 42sc

R3: turn, [6sc, (inc: 1hdc, 1dc), 2ch, skip 10st,

(inc: 1dc, 1hdc)]x2, 6sc (30)

R4-9: turn, 30sc Change to pink color (lighter)

Every time you need to make a color change, follow these steps:

- Finish the last stitch of the round and pull the yarn over slightly.
- Insert the hook through the center of the stitch, as shown in the image.
- Draw the new color and start the next round.
- Before finishing this round, pull the strand of the previous color and secure it to the new color with a simple knot.
- Leave the strands inside the piece so they become part of the filling.

I won't go into this explanation any further. From now on, whenever you make a color change, do it this way with the corresponding colors.

R10: 1ch, turn, BLO 30 triple inc hdc (90)



R11: 1ch, turn, (2hdc, 1hdc inc)x30, 1ss (120) R12-28: 1ch, 120hdc, 1ss (120)

R29: 1ch, FLO 120hdc, 1ss (120) link to video



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Use white colo yarn

R30: 1ch, BLO 120hdc, 1ss (120)

R31: (2ch, 1hdc in the same base, skip 1st, 1ss)x60

SLEEVES (X2)



Both sleeves are the same, the only difference is the starting point of each one:

- Left sleeve: Start at the base of the dc and ch increase you made in round 3 of the dress, making sure the increase is toward the back.
- Right sleeve: Start with the other increase, but this time with the one in front, on the right side of the dress.

To begin, pull out a loop and then continue knitting into the next stitch.

R1: linc, linc hdc, 6inc dc, linc hdc, linc, lss R2: turn,ldec,ldec hdc,6dec dc, ldec hdc, ldec R3: turn, l8ss approximately.

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Make an invisible closure using a wool needle.

Let me explain what a perfect closure is:

- After cutting the thread, pull it out and attach a tapestry needle.
- Skip a stitch and, in the next stitch, pass the tapestry needle under the chain that forms above the stitch.
- Then insert the tapestry needle just above the last stitch you made.

Whenever a perfect close is mentioned, follow these steps exactly.




PIECE FOR THE DRESS

Use pink color yarn

R1: MR 12hdc (12)

R2: turn, (1 hdc, 1 hdc inc) x 6 (18)

R3: turn, (2 hdc, 1 hdc inc) x 6 (24)

R4: turn, (3 hdc, 1 hdc inc) x 6 (30)

R5: turn, (4 hdc, 1 hdc inc) x 6 (36)

R6: turn, (5 hdc, 1 hdc inc) x 6 (42)

R7: turn, (6 hdc, 1 hdc inc) x 6 (48)

R8: turn, (7 hdc, 1 hdc inc) x 6 (54)

R9: turn, (8 hdc, 1 hdc inc) x 6 (60)

R10: turn, (9 hdc, 1 hdc inc) x 6 (66)

R11: turn, (10 hdc, 1 hdc inc) x 6 (72)

R12: turn, (11 hdc, 1 hdc inc) x 6 (78) R13: turn, (12 hdc, 1 hdc inc) x 6 (84)

R14: turn, (13 hdc, 1 hdc inc) x 6 (90)

R15: turn, 7 hdc, 1 hdc inc, (14 hdc, 1 hdc inc) x 5, 7 hdc (96)

R16: turn, 96ss, 1ch to secure, cut and hide the yarn





For this stitch, use a wool needle and only two strands of pink yarn, making invisible stitches.

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
- 1. Pre-alignment: Pin the piece before sewing.
- 2. Starting Point: Start at the back, aligning the center of the pink piece with the center of the dress.
- 3. End securing: Secures the edges of the piece to the front.
- ₱ For greater clarity, follow the step-by-step instructions in the video.





Using the lighter pink color yarn, work slip stitches around the entire top of the dress, taking up only the back strands.

Finish with 1 chain to secure and hide the strands.



Using short stitches on R1 and R2 of each sleeve, and using the same lighter pink, add these details to highlight the texture.

Add Velcro to the closure if you want it to be removable.

Otherwise, you can also sew it directly to attach it to the princess.

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SHOES (X2) Use Pink color yarn Start with 1 slip knot

R1: 4ch, in the 2nd start (2sc, 1 triple inc) x2 (10)

Note: R1 is identical to R1 for the legs.

Mark the 4th chain from the beginning to make it easier to locate the second triple increase.



R2: (2sc, 3inc)x2 (16) R3: (2sc, 6inc)x2 (28)

R4: BLO 28sc

R5-8: 28sc

R9: 2sc. 6dec, 14sc (22)

Make an invisible cast off and then repeat all rounds once more to knit the second shoe.

These shoes are custom-made, but they have a slight amount of give. Gently stretch them with your fingers and place them on the princess.
