Important Note:

This amigurumi is worked with tight V-shaped and spiral stitches. Do not close off each row unless indicated; make sure to always mark the beginning of each row. Please read the entire pattern before starting. We have a tutorial on our channel to make this amigurumi. You can access the links attached to each image if you have any questions. If you find any errors in this pattern, please contact me.







Amber measures approximately 30cm tall.

Materials:

- We have used 100% mercerized cotton thread, it measures approximately 3 mm thick and has 6 strands, in the colors: Flesh or skin (70g), Strong cinnamon, Wheat, cinnamon, wheat, clanco and dark brown (the last two only for eye embroidery), with a 2.5 mm hook
- 1mm thick yarn with 1.50mm hook (for details) in orange, brown, yellow, black, white, red and green
- 10mm safety eyes
- Needle to work
- Scissors
- Time marker
- Pins
- Stuffing for amigurumis
- Silicone bar or wire (body structure)
- Glue
- Velcro for closing the dress
- Wire (for the base of the feather headdress)


Abbreviations:

- R: Round
- ch: chain stitch
- MR: Magic ring
- sc: single crochet
- dec: decrease (close 2 sc together)
- inc: Increase (2sc in 1 stitch)
- dc: double crochet
- hdc: half double crochet
- ss: Slip stitch
- FLO: Front Loop Only (take only the front strand)
- BLO: Back Loop Only (take only the back strand)

Important Note:

This pattern can be adapted to create amigurumis of different sizes using different yarn thicknesses. Adjust the hook size according to the yarn thickness selected. Also consider the size of the safety eyes, if you choose to use them.

I hope you enjoy designing this pattern for you as much as I did.



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ARMS (X2)

Use flesh-colored yarn

R1: MR 6sc R2: 6inc (12) R3-4: 12sc

R5: 5sc, (bob stitch: 4hdc closed together in the

same place), 6sc (12)

R6: 12sc

R7: (4sc, 1dec)x2 (10)

R8-24: 10sc

Cut the yarn at the end of each arm and fill just a little.

PIERNAS (X2)

Start with flesh-colored thread yarn R1: 4ch, in the 2nd begin (2sc, 1triple inc)x2 (10)

Note: I suggest you mark Chain number 4 before starting to make the first single crochet, because once we crochet the 2nd repetition on the other side of the chains, right in that 4th chain is where we will make the last triple increase

R2: (2sc, 3inc) x2 (16)

R3: 3sc, 4inc, 4sc, 4inc, 1sc (24)

R4: BLO 24sc

R5-7: 24sc

Note: Before continuing, fill the plant with silicone glue. If you do not yet know our technique, please enter the link that I share with you.

R8: 6dec, 12sc (18)

R9: 18sc

R10: 3dec, 6sc, 1dec, 4sc (14)

R11-30: 14scChange to White color yarn

On the first leg you made you will cut the yarn and on the second leg you will change to White in the last single crochet of the R30 to make the underwear.

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R31: 2ch, 14sc on the other leg, 2sc on the 2ch, 14sc on the leg that started this Round (32) link to video



R32-36: 32sc R37: (6sc, 1dec) x4 (28) Change to Flesh color in the last dec of this R.





R38: 28sc R39: (5sc, 1dec) x4 (24) R40-48: 24sc



R49: 9sc, 10sc on one arm, 12sc, 10sc on the other arm, 3sc (44)



Note: Place a marker on each side, exactly where you mark is where you will make the connections with the arms.

R50: (2sc, 1dec) x11 (33)

R51-52: 33sc

R53: (1sc, 1dec) x11 (22)

R54: 22sc



Note: You must fill the fabric as you advance, creating a hole to then insert the silicone tube or whatever material you wish to use to support your head.



R55: 11dec (11) R56-57: 11sc R58: 1inc, 10sc (12)

R60: (3sc, 1inc) x6 (30) R61: (4sc, 1inc) x6 (36)

R62: 2sc, linc, (5sc, linc) x5, 3sc (42)

R63: (6sc, 1inc) x6 (48)

R64: 3sc, linc, (7sc, linc) x5, 4sc (54)


R65: 54sc

R66: (8sc, 1inc) x6 (60)

R67: 4sc, linc, (9sc, linc) x5, 5sc (66)

R68: (10sc, 1inc) x6 (72)

Note: You will need to create a hole in the body, prepare the silicone tube by creating a thin tip so it enters more easily and then insert the silicone, you can actually place it whenever you like

R69-77: 72 sc

R78: (10sc, 1dec)x6 (66)

R79-81: 66sc

Place the eyes between R73 and 74 with

approximately 13 stitches apart



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Note: If you want to further secure these eyes, watch our video where I show you in detail how to do it, but it is optional.



FACE EMBROIDERY

Note: You need to visit our video for all the details of the face, it will be easier for you.



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EARS (X2)

Make the ears with 8 points separating each eye. Their points will be the same, the difference will be where to start each one.

1ch, 1sc, 5hdc in the same stitch, 1sc, 1ss (see video)

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R82: (9sc, 1dec) x6 (60)

R83: 3sc, 1dec, (8sc, 1dec) x5, 5sc (54)

R84: (7sc, 1dec) x6 (48)

R85: 3sc, 1dec, (6sc, 1dec) x5, 3sc (42)

R86: (5sc, 1dec) x6 (36)

Note: It's time to cut the silicone if there is any excess and place filler around it.



R87: (4sc, 1dec)x6 (30) R88: (3sc, 1dec)x6 (24) R89: (2sc, 1dec)x6 (18) R90: (1sc, 1dec)x6 (12)

R91: 6dec (6)

Close with a yarn needle. See the link if

necessary.

Apply blush only if desired.

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Hair

Use strong tan color yarn and tart with 1slip knot

[54ch, in the 2nd star (1hdc, 1hdc inc)x10, 32hdc, 1sc]x20 1ch to secure and cut the strand, no length is needed, glue or sew the hair with a finer strand, it is always recommended to sew for greater security.

DRESS

Use Cinnamon yarn

R1: 43ch, on the 2nd start, BLO 42sc (42)

R2: turn, 42sc

R3: turn, [6sc, (inc: 1hdc, 1dc), 2ch, skip 10pts,

(inc: 1dc, 1hdc)]x2, 6sc (30)

R4-9: turn, 30sc

R10: 1ch, turn, 15hdc (together: 2hdc, 1ch, 2hdc), 14hdc (34)

R11: 1ch, turn, 1hdc inc, 14hdc (together: 2hdc,

1ch, 2hdc), 16hdc, 1hdc inc (39)

R12: 1ch, turn, 1hdc inc, 18hdc (together: 1hdc,

1ch, 1hdc), 18hdc, 1hdc inc, 1ss (43)

R13: 1ch, 21hdc (together: 1hdc, 1ch, 1hdc),

21hdc, 1ss (45)

R14: 1ch, 22hdc (together: 1hdc, 1ch, 1hdc),

22hdc, 1ss (47)

R15: 1ch, BLO 23hdc (together: 1hdc, 1ch, 1hdc),

23hdc, 1ss (49)

R16: 1ch, 24hdc (together: 1hdc 1ch, 1hdc),

24hdc, 1ss (51)

R17: 1ch, 25hdc (together: 1hdc, 1ch, 1hdc),

25hdc, 1ss (53)

Once you're done, cut the yarn, bring it to the back of the fabric, and carefully tuck it between the stitches.



MANGAS (X2)

Use Cinnamon colored thread.

Note: Both sleeves are knitted exactly the same; the only difference is where you start each one. Remember the two chains from row 3. Look at them carefully to identify which one to start with. Watch the video for a better understanding of row 1.



R1: 1ch, 2sc, (1hdc, 3hdc inc)x5, 2sc, 1ss (19) R2: 1ch, 2sc, 7hdc, 1hdc dic, 6hdc, 2sc, 1ss (18)

R3-5: 1ch, 18sc, 1ss (18) Realizar cierre perfecto



(Optional) When you finish each sleeve, you can make a perfect or invisible closure with the help of a wool needle, if you prefer.







Cut the strands you want to add to the dress; you can use as many as you like. In my case, I added only one for each strand of the dress. Only take the front strands of the stitch and pay attention to the correct position for inserting the hook. I used a 1.5 mm hook, as it was more comfortable for me, but you can use any number that suits you best.




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Using 1mm thick yarn and a 1.50mm hook, I slip stitched as close to the first layer of fringe as possible.



The last slip stitch is made right where this detail began. Then, cut the yarn, pull it out, and bring it to the inside of the dress, where you can knot it with the starting yarn to secure it and, finally, hide both.




For the center detail of the dress, I used Imm thick yarn with a 1.5mm hook. The color order is red, green, yellow, brown, and black. Start with a slip knot and chain 20 in red. Then, make an extra chain, this time pulling through the green yarn. Work 20 slip stitches in the loop that forms on the back of each red loop. When finished, cut the loop, leaving enough length to secure it to the dress.



Please note that for each subsequent color, you must start on the back loop indicated in the image, first pulling out the loop. Then, slip stitch the loops by pulling the back loops in the traditional way. Repeat this process for each color. For a better understanding, I recommend watching the video.

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Make sure to attach this piece as centered on the dress as possible. Bring the strands to the inside and glue the center together for extra hold. Inside the dress, tuck the remaining strands as far as possible.

Add a small piece of Velcro to the back to close the dress.





SHOES (X2)
Use tan thread with a 2.5mm hook.
Start with 1 slip knot.

R1: 4ch, start in the 2nd (2sc,1triple inc)x2 (10) link to the video

Note: R1 is identical to R1 for the legs. Mark the 4th chain from the beginning to make it easier to locate the second triple increase.

R2: (2sc, 3inc)x2 (16) R3: (2sc, 6inc)x2 (28)

R4: BLO 28sc

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R5-8: 28sc

When you finish row 8, cut the yarn (no need to leave it long). For the next row, start at the sixth stitch of the previous row, counting backward. Insert your hook in that stitch and pull through the loop to begin.

R9: 1ch, on the same base start 8sc,

6dec, 8sc (22)

R10-11: turn, 22sc (22) R12: turn, FLO 22sc (22)

R13-15: turn, 22sc (22) R16: turn, FLO 22sc (22)

R17-19: turn, 22sc (22)

1ch to fasten, break the yarn and pull it out

R20: start with 1 sliding knot, 12ch, BLO 22ss, 12ch.

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This shoe is custom-made, so to fit it on your foot, you'll need to stretch the fabric slightly with your fingers. Don't worry, the fabric won't be damaged. Then, add the fringe just as you did on the dress; this time, there will be three layers.








BASE OF THE FEATHER HEADDRESS Use brown yarn, with a 1.50mm hook R1: MR 8sc

R2-70: 8sc

Before closing with the help of the wool needle, make sure to place enough wire to maintain the shape after the headband.

Large (x4)
Use different colors for each one
Green, Orange, Red, and Yellow
With a 1.50mm hook
Start with a slip knot
15ch, in the 2nd ch begin 2ss (2ch, 1ss in the
2nd ch, 1ss in the foundation chains) x2
(3ch, 2ss starting on the 2nd ch, 1ss in the
foundation chains) x10
on the other side of the chains (3ch, 2ss
starting on the 2nd ch, 1ss in the foundation
chains)x10
(2ch, 1ss in the 2nd ch, 1ss in the foundation
chains) x2

12ss in the center of the feather, 1ch to secure

Medium (x4) link to the video
Use different colors for each one
Green, Orange, Red, and Yellow
With 1.50mm hook
Start with 1 slip knot
13ch, on the 2nd st, start BLO 2ss (2ch, 1ss in the 2nd st, 1ss in the foundation chains) x2
(3ch, 2ss starting on the 2nd st, 1ss in the foundation chains)x8
on the other side of the chains (3ch, 2ss starting on the 2nd st, 1ss in the foundation chains)x8
(2ch, 1ss in the 2nd st, 1ss in the foundation chains)x2

10ss in the center of the feather, 1ch to secure

Small (2) <u>link to the video</u>

Use different colors for each one Green and Orange

With a 1.50mm hook

Start with a slip knot

11ch, on the 2nd ch begin BLO 2ss (2ch, 1ss in the 2nd ch, 1ss in the foundation chains)x2 (3ch, 2ss starting on the 2nd ch, 1ss in the foundation chains)x6

on the other side of the chains (3ch, 2ss starting on the 2nd ch, 1ss in the foundation chains)x6

(2ch, 1ss in the 2nd ch, 1ss in the foundation chains)x2

8ss in the center of the feather, 1ch to secure



When you finish each feather, always tie an additional knot between the two strands (the beginning and the end), and then carefully hide them. Attach the feathers to the design with glue, in any order you prefer. I encourage you to watch the video to better understand how to make these feathers, as they are very easy to follow our guide. Although, if you prefer, you can also use real or artificial feathers... it's all a matter of creativity!

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PIECE IN RED

Use red yarn 1mm thick

With 1.50mm hook

R1: MR 8sc

R2: 8inc (16)

R3: (1sc, 1inc)x8 (24)

R4: (2sc, 1inc)x8 (32)


R5: 1sc, 1inc, (3sc, 1inc)x7, 2sc (40)

R6: (4sc, linc)x8 (48)

Change to white thread

CLOSING THE PIECE

R7: 1ss, (1ch, 1ss)x24
