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Important Note:

Please read the entire pattern before you begin knitting to familiarize yourself with the instructions and construction.

For this hat, it's important to maintain proper tension to achieve the final size. This project is worked in the round; unless otherwise indicated, each round will be closed with a slip stitch (sl st) and the next round will begin with a turning chain (ch). If you have any questions about the stitches or assembling the hat, please refer to the tutorial on our YouTube channel, GretaWings Plus, and use the links provided to go directly to the video section you need. If you find any errors or need help with the pattern, please contact me.

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You can sell your finished amigurumi however you like. If you choose to sell your finished item online, please include a link to our website in the description. This will also help support our project.

Note for Video Users

If you choose to use our video tutorial for visual guidance, please remember to change the audio track (or audio description) to English for better comprehension of the instructions.



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"Versatile Size: Although the initial circumference is designed for a 5-year-old child, the stitching technique used in this hat maximizes its elasticity. This allows the same pattern to comfortably fit the head of a teenager or even an adult, offering exceptional adaptability."

ABBREVIATIONS:

- R: Round
- ch: chain stitch
- MR: Magic ring
- sc: single crochet
- dec: decrease (close 2 sc together)
- inc: Increase (2sc in 1 stitch)
- dc: double crochet
- hdc: half double crochet
- ss: Slip stitch
- FLO: Front Loop Only (take only the front strand)
- BLO: Back Loop Only (take only the back strand)

MATERIALS:

- We used 100% acrylic braided wool of approximately 3mm, in a variegated color,
- with 4.00mm hook
- Needle to work
- Scissors
- Medium 100% acrylic yarn, size 4, pink or blue (for the pom pom)
- Cardboard (we will use it to form the pom pom, it is optional)

Size Adjustment Tips

This pattern is highly adaptable, allowing you to create hats for any size, from newborn to adult. The key to adjusting the size lies in two essential factors: the diameter and the height.

Material Adjustment:

If you decide to use a thinner or thicker yarn, adjust the hook size accordingly. Remember that a thicker yarn will make the hat larger even if you follow the same number of rounds.

I hope you enjoy designing and adapting this pattern to your needs as much as I enjoyed creating it. Happy knitting!



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Materials and hook



Elastic (15")

- R1: 8ch, in the 2nd begin BLO 7ss (7)
- R2-124: 1ch, turn, BLO 7ss
- R125: 1ch, turn 7ss joining with the other end to close the piece

Do not rotate or turn the piece

Continue with the hat  Reference Suggestion

- "When you reach this round, we strongly recommend consulting the video tutorial on our YouTube channel, GretaWings Plus, to clearly visualize the exact point where the hook should be inserted and to ensure the desired texture."

R1: 3ch, (1dc, 1dc-inc)x31, 1dc (94)

Note: beginning chains count as 1dc
 "Remember: beginning chains of a turn count as the first dc unless otherwise stated."

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Repeat R2 and R3 until you reach R15.

R2: 2ch, BLO 93hdc, 1ss (94)

The hat's texture is achieved by working only in a special loop that is NOT the traditional back loop (BLO). Please refer to the video tutorial or the links attached to this round to identify the correct loop where you should insert your hook.

R16: 2ch, BLO (2hdc, 1hdc-dec)x23, 1hdc, 1ss (71)

R17: 2ch, 70hdc, 1ss (71)

R18: 2ch, BLO (2hdc, 1hdc-dec)x17, 2hdc, 1ss (54)

R19: 2ch, 53hdc, 1ss (54)

R20: 2ch, BLO (2hdc, 1hdc-dec)x13, 1hdc, 1ss (41)

R21: 2ch, , 40hdc, 1ss (41)

R22: 2ch, BLO (2hdc, 1hdc-dec)x10, 1ss (31)

R23: 2ch, 30hdc, 1ss (31)

R24: 2ch, (1hdc, 1hdc-dec)x10, 1ss (21)

R3: 2ch, 93hdc,1ss (94)

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✿ Pom-pom (Optional)

Make the pom-pom following the detailed instructions below:

- 1.-To begin, cut out a rectangular piece of cardboard. The most important thing is the height, which should measure 8 cm. Then, cut the cardboard in half lengthwise to make it easier to remove later.
2. Secure the two halves of the cardboard with tape and begin wrapping the yarn around the cardboard approximately 100 times. Then, easily cut the tape and pass a double strand through the opening to make the knot stronger, and knot it loosely.
- 3.-Remove the cardboard and shape the pom-pom according to the step-by-step instructions in the pattern images.
4. Finally, when the pom-pom is ready, attach it to the hat with the same strands you used to knot the center.
